Box Council Mission Statement

The Box Curriculum Council serves in an advisory function to the Dean of the College of Education. The Council's primary goals are:

1. Initiate or hear suggestions for the improvement of instructional programs within the College of Education
2. Coordinate the curriculum for the College of Education;
3. Serve as the recommending body for the modification, addition, or deletion of courses and degree programs in the College of Education
4. Represent the College of Education in relation to university-wide curriculum matters;
5. Promote academic excellence and a professional image for the College of Education; and
6. Accept special assignments as requested by the Dean of the College of Education.

In matters of curriculum/course modification, the Box Council will study recommendations in light of state, university and college missions, goals, resources needed, and guidelines of national professional organizations and accrediting agencies. The Box Council's recommendations will be forwarded to the Dean.

Membership on the Box Curriculum Council will be comprised of elected members from each COE department, the School of Human Sciences (includes Agricultural Information Science and Education), a graduate assistant, and an undergraduate student. Beginning Fall 2003, K-12 practitioners who serve on Teacher Education Council will become rotating members of the Box Council; each TEC practitioner will meet the Box Council at least once per academic year. Ex-officio members include the Assistant Dean for Curriculum and Learning Outcomes, the Associate Dean from Arts and Sciences, the Director of Clinical/Field-Based Instruction and Licensure, and the elected chairs of the Graduate Coordinators Advisory Committee (GCAC) and the Undergraduate Education Advisory Committee (UGEAC). The college representative to the University Graduate Council will also serve in an Ex-officio capacity on the Box Council if he/she is not an elected member.

To serve on the Box Council one must at least have the rank of the assistant professor, tenure track with at least three years in rank at Mississippi State University (elected by tenured track faculty). **Each member of the Council shall serve a period of three years.** A member may serve up to two consecutive terms, after which s/he is ineligible for membership on the Council for one year. The graduate assistant in the College will be appointed by the Dean's Office. The undergraduate student representative will be elected from the College of Education Ambassadors.

The Box Council will meet on the **third** Friday of each month at 1:00 p.m. in Allen 265. **A minimum of five voting members must be present in order for the Box Council to conduct business at a meeting. Proxy votes will be accepted.**
