

Environmental and Natural Resource Economics Educator Workshop

Description: This workshop is Day One of the first annual Applied Economics Educator Academy hosted by MSU Extension and the MSU Department of Agricultural Economics.

Participants will learn the essentials of environmental and natural resource economics as well as tips on how to present these concepts using diagrams and interactive classroom games. These difficult concepts will be understandable to novices in economics. Topics include: Econ 101 and Resources for Teaching Economics; Games to Teach Supply and Demand, Public Goods Game, When Markets Do Not Work, Managing Natural Resources over Time; Introduction to Cost-Benefit Analysis; and Bringing Environmental and Natural Resource Economics to Life in the Classroom.
