

Scholarship List

The following is a brief summary of the criteria for the scholarships available through the College of Education Dean's Office. Barry Box Memorial Scholarship – Awarded to College of Education undergraduate students on the basis of scholarship.

Bert Jenkins Scholarship in Coaching – Awarded to undergraduate juniors and seniors in the Department of Kinesiology with a concentration in coaching, who maintain a 2.80 GPA and have good moral character and demonstrated leadership ability, with a preference given to graduates of Gulfport High School.

Bobby and Regina Sanford Memorial Scholarship – Awarded to juniors or seniors enrolled in the College of Education with a demonstrated academic achievement (3.0 GPA or better), who graduated from a Mississippi public school.

Charles D. Haven, Jr. Annual Scholarship – Awarded to newly-enrolled students at MSU who are residents of Huntsville-Decatur, AL, have leadership ability, and have good moral character.

Cheryl Prewitt Vocal Scholarship – Based on high school music achievement, music aptitude, academic achievement, and outstanding character. Preference given to students from Mississippi majoring in Music.

Choral Ensemble Annual Scholarship – Given annually to a student who is a resident of Mississippi, who has a minimum 3.0 GPA and who participates in the Choral ensemble.

Dewey and Marie Malouf Scholarship – Undergraduate students majoring in the College of Education with priority given to students from Leflore County with a demonstrated academic achievement, leadership abilities and good moral character.

Durward Dunn Physical Education Scholarship – Awarded to students majoring in Physical Education.

Ellen Curtis Ricci Special Education Scholarship – Outstanding juniors or seniors majoring in Special Education. Scholarship based on academic record, merit and demonstrated need. Awarded in the Spring only.

Emma Grace Hayes Memorial Scholarship – Awarded to Special Education students with at least 30 semester hours toward their degree and a 2.80 GPA or higher. Recipients are required to complete 20 or more hours of volunteer service assisting children with special needs.

Francis N. Matthews Scholarship – Undergraduate students with demonstrated academic achievement who plan to teach in Technology Education. Available to juniors and seniors with a financial need for scholarship aid.

Frank and Ann Chiles Family Annual Scholarship – Awarded to students majoring in Elementary, Secondary, or Special Education. Based on academic achievement, community service, and volunteer spirit (participation in campus organizations).

George Walker Bush Scholarship – Awarded to an outstanding College of Education undergraduate major with a demonstrated academic excellence, leadership qualities, and potential as an elementary/secondary teacher.
Available to seniors only.

Hal and Joyce Polk Music Education Scholarship – Given annually to a full-time student in the Department of Music. Based on academic achievement (a minimum GPA of 3.0) and musical ability (as demonstrated by an audition).

Harold Smith-Baldwin Piano & Organ Annual Scholarship – Awarded to full-time students in Industrial Technology with 32 credit hours toward their degree and a minimum 3.0 GPA.

Herbert M. Handley Scholarship – Awarded to undergraduate students in the College of Education with demonstrated academic achievement.

Jack L. Beall Scholarship – Available to entering students majoring in a Math/Science field who plan to remain in MS and teach. The award is based on a minimum GPA of 3.0 and demonstrated academic achievement.

Joe and Catherine Fortunato Family Scholarship – Awarded to College of Education undergraduate students on the basis of academic achievement (3.0 GPA or better) and financial need.

John Albert Bodron Memorial Scholarship – Awarded to graduates of Biloxi High School who maintain a 3.0 GPA or higher and have a minimum ACT score of 25.

Julia Higgins Carskadon Early Childhood Education Scholarship – Awarded to a full-time doctoral student enrolled in Curriculum, Instruction, and Special Education with emphasis in early childhood education.

Katherine Gardner Thomas Piano Scholarship – Awarded to piano students.

Lisa Blendinger-Bell Scholarship – Awarded to outstanding graduate students in Educational Leadership.

Mann-Parker Council Education Scholarship – Awarded to support the graduate work of a counselor education student pursuing their doctorate.

Max and Patricia Jobe Scholarship – Awarded to College of Education students who have completed at least 30 semester hours toward a degree and who have maintained a 2.80 GPA on a 4.0 scale.

McClendon/Holliman Scholarship – Worthy juniors and seniors majoring in Special Education based on merit and need.

Merchants and Farmers Bank Scholarship – Undergraduate majors in the College of Education with priority given to recipients from counties in Mississippi which have Merchants and Farmers bank and who express a desire to work in Mississippi after graduation. Based on academic performance, need and demonstrated leadership abilities.

Merrill and Carrie Hawkins Scholarship – Awarded to full-time juniors and seniors enrolled in Education with demonstrated academic achievement, good moral character, and leadership ability.

Nan Carpenter Cain Scholarship – Undergraduate students with demonstrated academic achievement majoring in Industrial, Technology and Education. Must have leadership qualities and financial need.

Nancy Kubin Wallner Martin – Undergraduate students majoring in Elementary Education, Secondary Education, or Special Education based on academic record and financial need.

Quay Webb Camp Education Scholarship – Awarded to Elementary Education or Secondary Education students (preference given to students transferring from Mississippi Community Colleges) with a good academic record.

Rehabilitation, Inc. Endowed and Annual Scholarship – Awarded to graduate students in Counselor Education on the basis of academic achievement (maintaining a GPA of 3.0) and financial need.

Royer/Scarborough Brass Scholarship – Given annually to a full-time returning music education major (incoming freshmen are not eligible). Awarded to an outstanding brass performer on the basis of academic achievement (maintaining a GPA of 3.0) and financial need.

Dr. Susan McLaren Brooks Memorial Scholarship – Awarded to full-time students from Mississippi enrolled in Elementary Education with demonstrated academic achievement (3.0 GPA or higher).

Thomas McKnight Scholarship – Awarded to Juniors who transfer from Northwest Mississippi Community College who have a minimum 3.0 GPA (not for PE majors). Also awarded to doctoral candidates in School Psychology.

Wilburn Pearson Sudduth Memorial Scholarship – Awarded to students majoring in Teaching and Coaching, priority given to students from Oktibbeha County. Scholarship based on achieving good grades and an active participation in many activities, good moral character, leadership and financial need.

Linda and Vincent McGrath Scholarship – Awarded to undergraduate students who are active members of KDP and who are majoring in Secondary Education or seeking teacher certification in the School of Human Sciences or the Department of Kinesiology.

Lucinda Rose Scholarship – Outstanding undergraduate students who are active members of KDP with demonstrated academic achievement, leadership qualities and financial need majoring in Elementary Education.
