1. Update from the Dean:

The COE finished the year just under \$18 million in external funding. This places us 3rd among colleges and just slightly behind Engineering.

The capital campaign that was rolled out yesterday has education as a primary component. This is a first in MSU's history and a credit to the good work of our faculty and staff.

Our work in support of the Oktibbeha County Schools is paying dividends. Measures of the district's performance have increased and we are being asked to have an even greater role in assisting them.

The Louisville Public Schools are now officially the COE's first Professional Development School (we hope the first of several). There will be a formal announcement soon.

We are having preliminary discussions with the Starkville Public Schools regarding a university school. Despite some rumors to the contrary, the school would not be a "stand alone" school, but would be a part of the Starkville Consolidated District. These discussions are VERY preliminary with faculty to be involved once a general agreement is reached regarding the form such a school should take.

Finally, despite no new positions, the Dean's Office is undergoing some restructuring to better address the demands of our new national accreditation standards.
