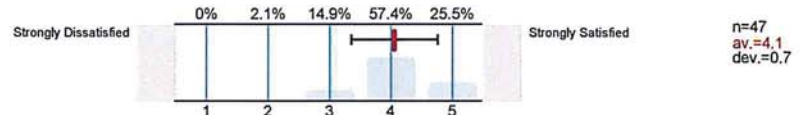


4.13) On average, how often did you receive advising from your advisor during each semester?

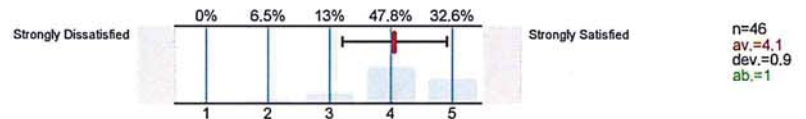
